

Festive season poses challenge for Delhi govt to contain rising coronavirus cases

With rise in positivity rate of COVID cases particularly across six districts of the national capital including the North, Central, North East, East, North West and South East districts, forthcoming festive and winter season are going to be key challenge for the Delhi government to contain the infectious disease.

Comparing the COVID trajectory of Delhi with that of the country, the recovery rate of India is currently more than 92% while that of Delhi is 89%. Against a national case fatality rate of 1.49%, Delhi continues to have a fatality rate of 1.71%. Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare Dr. Harsh Vardhan also expressed concern over the surge in number of cases and the high positivity rate in the North, Central, North East, East, North West and South East districts of Delhi, at a meeting with Anil Bai-



jal, Lt. governor, Delhi and Satyendra Kumar Jain, Delhi Health Minister and other officials concerned on Thursday. He stressed on the need to create awareness asking the officers concerned to instil COVID appropriate behaviour among the masses and blunt the momentum of the infectious disease by the end of the year, so that it loses its potency. He also reiterated the government's commitment to vaccinate 20-25 Crore citizens including those involved in frontline healthcare by mid-2021. The Union Minister was also informed in this respect that Delhi continues to have a highly skewed RAT to RT-PCR ratio - 77% of the tests are RAT based while RT-PCR comprises only 23% of the total tests. Noting that false negative results might give way to complacency among the COVID infected, he pressed for mandatory testing of all RAT negative persons if they develop ILI/SARI symptoms after-

Delhi doing much better than other metro cities, says Jain

Delhi Health Minister Satyendar Jain said on Thursday the national capital was doing much better than all other metro cities in India and was on the 17th position in terms of COVID-19 deaths per million population. Delhi recorded over 6,800 fresh COVID-19 cases for the first time on November 4 taking the infection tally in the city to over 4.09 lakh, while 51 new fatalities pushed the death

toll to 6,703, authorities said. "Delhi is on the 17th position in COVID-19 death per million population. Far behind all metro cities," Jain posted on Twitter. "From day one of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Delhi government has worked around the clock to keep a check on the fatality rate," a government statement said. The Delhi government has also stringently implemented the lockdown rules

in the city and with time, aggressively increased the testing capacity in the capital, it said. While comparing with other metro cities of India, it should be noted that Delhi was at the 17th position in terms of COVID-19 deaths per million population with 338 fatalities, whereas Mumbai tops the list with around 831 deaths, followed by Chennai (518), Kolkata (503) and Bangalore Urban (408), the statement said.

Dr. Stujeet Singh, Director, National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) cautioned the state health authorities to be alert in the forthcoming festive and winter season and requested for the formation of a committee of medical experts for better clinical management of COVID patients. Baijal noted that Delhi administration has been cautioned by experts about possible surges because of ongoing festive season and facilitation of inter-state transport. He also informed that the administration is working to inculcate changes in standard operating proce-

dures for more efficient containment of the disease spread. Delhi health minister Jain requested the Centre to increase the number of ICU beds in AIIMS New Delhi and other Central Hospitals to augment the present capacity which has come under strain.

Amrapali group directors, others held in 14 old cases

The Amrapali group's Directors Anil Kumar Sharma and Shiv Priya, along with others have been arrested by Delhi Police's Economic Offence Wing in connection with 14 cases registered against them, said Delhi police on Thursday.



taining permission from the court, the EOW team interrogated and formally arrested the accused Anil Kumar Sharma and Shiv Priya in Case FIR No 279/19 EOW and 309/18 PS Anand Vihar, New Delhi." Joint Commissioner of Police, EOW, O.P. Mishra said.

In a case registered in 2019 at EOW, the complainant alleged that Amrapali Centurian Park Pvt Ltd, a company of Amrapali Group, had launched its project "Amrapali Centurian Park Terrace Homes" at Plot No GH-05, Sector Techzone-IV, Greater Noida, giving it wide publicity with advertisements in leading newspapers and claiming that the project is approved by the competent authority.

According to the complainant, Amrapali Centurian had proposed 2, 3 and 4 BHK flats having super area ranging from 885 square feet to 2,070 square feet with all modern amenities and facilities. After being influenced by the advertisement published in the newspapers of the said project and the Directors of the company, he had booked two flats in year 2017 and made full payment of the flats and the builder-buyer agreement was executed. However, possession was yet to be given.

During the period 2010-2014 the Amrapali Group proposed to construct around 42,000 residential flats, in the Noida and Greater Noida area. The Group took advances from buyers, ranging from 40 per cent to 100 per cent of the value of the flats, and an allotment-cum-flat buyer agreement was executed. The Group had promised to complete the construction and hand over the possession of the apartments, within a period of 36 months but they failed to give possession even after a period of more than 10 years.

The Economic Offences Wing had recently arrested the Directors and other officials of the Amrapali Group in 14 more cases. Charge sheets have already been filed in 15 cases.

North DMC: Nurses and para-medical staff call off their strike

Striking nurses and para-medical staff of five major hospitals and 17 polyclinics of North Delhi Municipal Corporation (North DMC) called off their agitation on Thursday on release of their salary.

The mayor of North Delhi, Jai Prakash, on Thursday along with Rajya Sabha Member, Vijay Goel, and former mayor Avtar Singh met the striking nurses and para-medical staff of the five major hospitals and 17 polyclinics of North Delhi Municipal Corporation.

They informed the striking health staff that their salary upto September, 2020 has been released. He appealed them to resume duties in the public interest as patients are facing tough time due to their strike.



The nurses and para-medical staff on his appeal called off their strike and agreed to resume their duties.

Mayor Prakash said that we are making efforts to release salary of all the hospital and health institutions' staff in a single attempt. He said that it is only the municipal administration that knows how the funds are arranged to release salary of

the employees in the wake of non-cooperation and exploitation of the corporation by the government of NCT of Delhi.

He said that it is evident from the past, until there was AAP government in Delhi, the corporations never faced such situation of financial crunch where releasing of salary of employees on time has become a challenge.

Kalindi Kunj: Boy brutally murdered for refusing to bring snacks

A-14-year-old boy was brutally stabbed to death by five drunk men after he refused to bring snacks for them, said Delhi police on Thursday.

The incident was reported in South East Delhi's Madanpur Khadar Extn area in Wednesday night, they added.

The injured boy was taken to Apollo hospital where he was declared brought death. A police team rushed at the crime scene and hospital and taken the investigation.



The boy lived in Madanpur Khadar Extension was on his way to a local Dhaba to bring breads for his family, said a family member. According to family, there were four to five accused who were boozing on the street and when the boy refused to bring snacks for them, they started beating him and stabbed to death.
