Two held after encounter in Noida

TSN/Noida
The police station, Dadri, has arrested two miscreants during an encounter on the Eastern Peripheral Highway on Tuesday night.

A miscreant was also injured during the encounter, while three suspects managed to escape from the spot. The police have admitted the injured miscreant to the hospital for treatment.

The local police claims that the accused miscreants along with their gang used to steal diesel from trucks parked on the highway.

Greater Noida DCP Rajesh Singh said that the Dadri police station was checking on the Eastern Peripheral Highway late on Tuesday night. During checking, the miscreants travelling a vehicle started firing on the police team. In the retaliation one of the miscreants identified as Mustafa resident of Dhaulana, Hapur was shot in the leg.

Four miscreants fled from the spot. However, the police chased and caught one of the miscreants. The arrested miscreant has been identified as Momin of Gulavathi, Bulandshahr.

The police has recovered an Eicher canter, 100 litre of diesel, oil extraction equipment, pipe and a pistol from the accused.

About eight cases are registered against the miscreant Mustafa under various sections including gangster.

Kejriwal, Sisodia target Centre for rejecting Delhi govt's doorstep ration delivery scheme

■ Manish Sisodia said a letter from the Centre informed that the Delhi govt's proposal of the scheme has been rejected. ■ Sisodia claimed that the Delhi govt never sent any proposal regarding the scheme to the Centre.

The AAP government here on Wednesday said the Centre "rejected" its doorstep ration delivery scheme on "funny excuses", with Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal asking how the country will progress amid so much dispute and politics.

Addressing a press briefing, senior Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) leader and Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia said a letter from the Centre on Tuesday informed that the Delhi government's proposal of the scheme has been rejected.

The deputy chief minister blamed Prime Minister Narendra Modi for it.

Later in a series of tweets, Kejriwal charged the BJP-led Centre of indulging in disputes with the states.

"A letter from the Centre has come. It is very painful. The doorstep ration delivery scheme was rejected on grounds such as what will happen if ration delivery vans break down or get



stuck in traffic, how will rations reach beneficiaries living on third floors of a building (India of 21st century has reached the moon and here you are stuck on third floor), and how will rations will be delivered to beneficiaries who live in narrow lanes," he said in a tweet in Hindi. Sisodia too raised the

same points, blaming Modi for rejecting of the scheme.

In another tweet, Kejriwal said having disputes with everyone was not right. "Fighting with everyone all the time is not right - Twitter, Lakshadweep, Mamta didi, Maharashtra, Jharkhand, Delhi government, farmers, traders, and

even the Chief Secretary of West Bengal," he said.

"How will the country progress amid so much dispute and politics? Do not fight over doorstep ration delivery scheme. It is in the interest of the nation," the Delhi chief minister added. Sisodia, however, claimed that the Delhi government never sent any proposal regarding the scheme to the Centre.

"Ration distribution under the public distribution system (PDS) is the responsibility of the state. They had objection over the scheme for having 'Mukhya Mantri' in its title, which we removed. What proposal did they reject when none was sent to them," he asked.

The AAP leader asserted that the doorstep delivery of ration scheme has to be implemented and accused Prime Minister Modi of picking fights with everyone.

Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, dated June 22, shared by Sisodia raised various objections on ration delivery, administrative and financial aspects of the scheme.

"Therefore, in view of the above observations and concerns, it is clarified that the proposal of Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi does not meet the statutory and functional requirements of the National Food Security Act and therefore, the proposal made by GNCTD cannot be accepted," it read.

The Delhi government planned to launch the scheme for the doorstep delivery of ration in June.

The launch was halted after the lieutenant governor returned the file on the scheme stating that it could not be implemented, according to a statement from the Chief Minister's Office.

According to the Delhi government, if implemented, the scheme would benefit 72 lakh ration cardholders in the city.

Delhi govt grants Covid relief disbursement to 1,825 workers

The Delhi government on Wednesday granted Covid relief disbursement of Rs 10,000 each to 1,825 construction workers registered under the Delhi Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Board, according to an official statement.

The construction workers, registered with the board before September 30, would have to renew their membership to be eligible for the financial aid, read the statement from the government.

"I urge all construction workers who were members of the Board before 30th September, 2018 to renew their membership with the Construction Board so that they are able to receive disbursement benefits," Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia said.

"When the first lockdown was imposed due to the pandemic last year, the Delhi government was one of the first to grant relief disbursement to all the 39,600 workers who were registered with the Board in the month of March 2020," he added.

Girl reunited with family with help of Delhi Police

Fed up with being scolded constantly by her mother over studies, a 12-year-old wannabe TikTok star left from home in south Delhi, but was later reunited with her family with the help of Delhi Police.

According to the police, the minor girl took a train from Delhi and reached Etawah in Uttar Pradesh. The matter came to light after the girl's mother visited Sangam Vihar police station on June 18 and stated that her daughter was allegedly kidnapped. He informed that her daughter was carrying a mobile

phone but the device was not active, the police said. Next day, the girl's mother informed ASI Jai Singh that she received a call from a woman, named Shanti Devi, who stated that her daughter was found sitting at Etawah railway station, a senior police officer said.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (South) Atul Kumar Thakur said, "Our team reached Etawah but the phone of the woman was found to be switched off. With the help of technical assistance and locals, our team located Shanti Devi."

The team reached finally located Shanti Devi's house and recovered the missing girl from there on June 20, he said. When interrogated, Devi revealed that the girl was found sitting at Etawah railway station. Hence, she took the girl with her to her house and informed her mother. But her mobile phone got switched off as it was an old phone, Thakur said.

"The girl said she left her home because she wanted to be a TikTok star and her mother used to scold her about studies. She then took a train from Delhi and reached Etawah but got scared and went with Devi to her house," he said.

6 arrested for duping people on pretext of providing jobs

Six men were arrested here for allegedly cheating people on the pretext of providing jobs, police said on Wednesday.

The accused Satish Kumar Singh (32), Naveen Kumar (24), Abhishek Shrivastav (23), Ajit Kumar (20), Sudhir (24) and Ravi Singh (20) residents of Jahangirpuri were arrested from northwest Delhi Adarsh Nagar area.

On April 10, police received a complaint from a man, Parvesh Kumar, who alleged that he was cheated after he applied for a store supervisor's job through an online advertisement, police said.

He received a call from an unknown person who claimed to be the manager of the store.

The caller told Parvesh that he was shortlisted for the role and asked for documents on WhatsApp, saying he would have a telephonic interview after their verification.



Later, the complainant was asked to pay Rs 650 for document verification and Rs 3,100 for the uniform. He paid the amount through UPI, according to police.

The alleged fraudsters told him that his selection was confirmed and asked for Rs 5,000 as security deposit for the laptop that he would get from the company for official work. He paid that amount as well, police said.

When they asked for Rs 11,000 as insurance, he suspected that he had become

a victim of fraud and informed police.

"During investigation, a fake call centre was found at Panchvati in Adarsh Nagar and six accused persons were arrested. Satish, Shrivastav and Naveen shared the profit in the ratio of 40, 30 and 30 per cent respectively. They gave commission to callers Ravi, Sudhir and Ajeet on performance basis," Additional Deputy Commissioner of Police (northwest) Gurilal Singh Sidhu said.

Satish used to open bank accounts with documents taken from persons job applicants and asked for others to transfer the money to them, police said. They would put their advertisement online about job vacancies in different companies and would get data of job aspirants. Then, they would call them impersonating as HR executives of different consultancies and ask for documents, Sidhu said. They asked them to pay money on different occasions and would send fake appointment letters.

Man posing as CBI officer steals cash, documents in Delhi; arrested

A man was arrested along with his accomplices for allegedly impersonating as a CBI officer and stealing Rs 50,000 along with essential documents from another person in south-west Delhi, police said on Wednesday.

According to police, the victim, Jafaruddin, reached Delhi from Bharatpur in Rajasthan on June 19 to buy clothes from Jama Masjid here. He took an auto-rickshaw from Dhaula Kuan for his destination, and found that a man was already sitting in the vehicle. After a certain distance, accused Sanjeev Gill (58) boarded the auto and introduced himself as a CBI officer. He then started checking the luggage of Jafaruddin and managed to steal Rs 50,000 and some documents from the victim's bag, they said.

The police said the auto driver and the other passenger were Gill's associates.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (Southwest) Ingit Pratap Singh said, "Using technical surveillance, the registration number of the auto rickshaw was obtained and the accused Ritesh Kumar was arrested from Uttam Nagar. An amount of Rs 12,000 was seized from his possession." During interroga-
