

No case of Delta plus variant of COVID-19 in Delhi so far: Jain

New Delhi
Delhi Health Minister Satyendar Jain on Wednesday said the national capital has not reported any case of Delta plus variant of COVID-19 so far, adding that there is no communication from the Centre to make any special arrangement to deal with it.

There is no separate communication from the Centre to make special preparations for the Delta plus variant. Also, Delhi has not reported any such cases so far," Jain told reporters here. Delhi's active Covid-19 cases declined to 1,379, lowest after Feb 28

The active number of Covid-19 cases in Delhi has dropped to 1,379, the lowest after February 28. The national capital had witnessed 94 fresh COVID infections and 6 deaths in the last 24 hours, according to the health bulletin on COVID-19 issued by the Delhi government on Wednesday.

The capital registered 240 recoveries in the last 24 hours, taking the cumulative recoveries to 14,07,832. The new cases pushed the cumulative caseload of the national capital to 14,34,188 while the new fatalities mounted the COVID death toll to 24,977. The positivity rate of 0.12 per cent was registered after 56,899 tests conducted during the 24-hour period. The fatality rate in the national capital currently

stands at 1.74 per cent. According to the bulletin, 2,03,158 eligible beneficiaries were vaccinated in the last 24 hours, while cumulative 77,53,986 beneficiaries have been inoculated.

On April 20, Delhi registered the biggest spike of new 28,395 coronavirus cases since the pandemic began last year. On April 26, the city registered the highest ever positivity rate of 36.24 per cent. The Delhi government imposed a lockdown in the national capital on April 19 at the peak of the second wave of COVID-19. The lockdown was extended a few times since then.

After a continuous decline in daily coronavirus cases for several days, Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal announced a phased unlocking process from May 31. The Delhi government has also allowed gymnasiums to open with 50 per cent capacity and permitted weddings at banquet halls, marriage halls, and hotels with a ceiling of 50 persons.

Physical PTMs to be held in Delhi govt schools from July 19-31: Sisodia

The Delhi government schools will conduct physical parent-teacher meetings (PTMs) for all classes from July 19 to July 31 to discuss the progress of students amid the new normal, Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia announced on Wednesday.



Sisodia, who is also the education minister of Delhi, said special PTMs will be conducted jointly with MCD teachers for the students of Class 6 who have joined government schools from municipal schools this year.

Sisodia, who is also the education minister of Delhi, said special PTMs will be conducted jointly with MCD teachers for the students of Class 6 who have joined government schools from municipal schools this year. "The schools have been closed in Delhi since March last year. They were briefly opened for the senior classes earlier this year, but again had to be closed due to the Covid situation and there is no possibility of reopening the schools anytime soon. However, the online classes are going on as per the schedule of the session," he said at an online press conference.

"Online learning has enhanced the role that parents play in their child's life. Parents have always been a part of children's education but their role has been enhanced. Keeping this in mind, the Directorate of Education (DOE) has decided to conduct PTMs for the parents of all students in government schools. These meetings will be a space for the parents to understand how to provide regular learning support to their children and they will be required to attend physically," Sisodia added. The PTMs will be conducted in small groups, keeping in mind the Covid

regulations. The parents will be informed through text messages or WhatsApp by the teachers and a clear message regarding the date and time slot will be sent to them. Sisodia said there will be a special focus on Class 6 students whose PTMs will be conducted jointly by the teachers of Delhi government schools and MCD schools. Every year, nearly 1.7 lakh Class 6 students join Delhi government schools from municipal schools.

"These PTMs will be very important for the students transitioning from the MCD feeder schools to the DOE schools. After holding review meetings with MCD officials, we have created a

structure for joint PTMs by MCD and DOE teachers. The PTMs for Class 6 students will be done jointly by MCD school teachers and DOE school teachers. "This decision has been taken to ease the transition of the students from MCD to DOE schools and ensure that they receive adequate emotional and learning support in a new environment. I request all parents with children transitioning to Class 6 to attend this parent-teacher meeting," Sisodia said.

Delhi Police sends notice to Twitter over child pornography content on platform

The Delhi Police has sent a notice to micro-blogging site Twitter seeking details about steps taken by it against circulation of child pornography content on its platform, officials said on Wednesday.



A senior police officer said the notice was sent to Twitter on Tuesday. He said the police have sought to know the steps taken by Twitter officials concerned against child sexual abuse content on their platform and sought details of the accounts circulating such material. The Delhi Police had registered an FIR against Twitter for allegedly allowing access to child pornography on its platform following a complaint by the National Commission for Protection

of Child Rights (NCPCR). The case was registered under relevant provisions of the Indian Penal Code (IPC), Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) and the IT Act, police said. This comes days after the NCPCR, the country's apex child rights body, asked Deputy Commissioner of Police (Cyber Cell) Anshu Roy to explain why no action had been taken against Twitter as per its letter to the Delhi Police dated May 29.

He said the police have sought to know the steps taken by Twitter officials concerned against child sexual abuse content on their platform and sought details of the accounts circulating such material. The Delhi Police had registered an FIR against Twitter for allegedly allowing access to child pornography on its platform following a complaint by the National Commission for Protection

In its letter, the NCPCR had asked the Delhi Police to book Twitter on the basis of the findings of its recent inquiry in which it had found that child sexual abuse material (CSAM) was easily available on the platform.
