Illegal arms factory busted in Ghaziabad; five held

Ghaziabad: The police have busted an illegal arms factory here and seized a huge cache of weapons and ammunition, officials said on Saturday. Five men have also been arrested, they said.

The illegal arms factory was being run near the culvert of Shahzadpur village road of Muradnagar town here, police said.

Senior Superintendent of Police, Pawan Kumar, told reporters that five pistols of .32 bore, 72 cartridges, 20 half-furnished pistols, 55 barrels of .32 bore, 13 magazines, 250 magazine springs, ten semi-prepared magazines, 90 side plates, 17 trigger guards along with manufacturing instruments and other parts of pistols have been seized.

The accused have been identified as Mohammad Mustafa, a resident of Bihar's Munger, Salam and Kaifi Alam, both from Muradnagar here, Salman, and a woman named Asgari who hails from Meerut. Two of their accomplices — Zahiruddin and Faiyyaz — both from Meerut are absconding, Kumar said. The accused told the police that the factory owner Zahiruddin, along with his wife Asgari, partner Faiyyaz, and nephew Salman, used to manage raw material for forging the illegal firearms.

Two days after bringing the raw materials, they were going to sell the fully finished pistols to "anti-social elements", according to the police. The police have also recovered Rs 1.5 lakh cash from the accused. The cash recovered was the proceeds from the arms' sale, and was kept for equal distribution and for purchasing raw material and other implements, police said.

10 arrested after raids on illegal hukka bars in West Delhi

New Delhi: Ten people were arrested during a major crackdown by the Delhi Police on illegal hukka bars in West Delhi. According to the police, some restaurants owners, managers were serving illegal hukka to their customers. After receiving the information, police teams from Rajouri garden and Punjabi Bagh police stations conducted raids and lodged first information reports (FIRs) against the hukka sellers.

Surprise checks were made at various clubs situated at Club Road, Punjabi Bagh, by the team of Punjabi Bagh police station. During the raid, a lounge and bar was found openly serving hukka on its premises at the open terrace. Accordingly, a case under sections 186/269/270 of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and sections 4/6/21/24 of the Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act (COPTA) Act was registered against the manager and owner of the lounge and bar in Punjabi Bagh.

During the raid, a total of five hukkas were recovered from the restaurant. The manager of the restaurant was arrested in the case. Raids were also conducted at lounge and bars in Punjabi Bagh and Club Road from where two hukkas each were recovered.

FIRs were also lodged under sections 186/269/270 IPC and under sections 4/6/21/24 of the COPTA Act in connection with the seizure.

Covid positivity rate in national capital raises to 0.08 percent

New Delhi: Delhi did not report any death due to COVID-19 for the fourth consecutive day on Saturday while the number of new infections was 55 with a positivity rate of 0.08 per cent, according to data shared by the city health department.

After showing gradual fall, the number of cases has again risen, with Saturday's count being the highest in the last 15 days, data showed. The city's positivity rate also increased to 0.08 per cent.

The new cases took the national capital's infection tally to 14,37,929. Over 14.12 lakh patients have recovered from the virus.

The death toll due to the coronavirus infection in Delhi stood at 25,082. The national capital has not reported any death due to the coronavirus since Tuesday.

Saturday is also the 23rd time since the start of the second wave of the pandemic in the national capital that zero fatality has been reported in a day.



On March 2 this year, the national capital had reported zero death due to the virus. On that day, the number of new infections stood at 217 and the positivity rate was 0.33 per cent.

The second wave swept the city during April-May. According to the latest bulletin, a total of 70,303 tests — 48,510 RT-PCR tests and 21,793 rapid antigen tests — were conducted a day ago.

The number of active cases decreased to 354 on Saturday from 362 a day before.

The number of people under home isolation was 80 on Saturday while it was 83 a day before, and the number of containment zones slightly decreased to 128 from 131 on Friday, the bulletin said.

On Friday, 35 fresh cases were recorded as the positivity rate stood at 0.05 per cent, according to official figures.

On Thursday, the daily case count stood at 39 with a positivity rate of 0.06 per cent.

Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal had recently cautioned that the chances of the third wave of the COVID-19 pandemic were quite real, while he asserted that his government was preparing on a "war-footing" to combat it.

Delhi had been reeling under a brutal second wave

of the pandemic that is sweeping the country, claiming a massive number of lives daily, and the oxygen supply shortage issue at various hospitals had added to the woes.

Since April 19, both daily cases and single-day deaths count had been spiralling up, with over 28,000 cases and 277 deaths recorded on April 20; rising to 306 fatalities on April 22. On May 3, the city registered a record 448 deaths.

However, the number of cases have shown a downward trend and the positivity rate too has been shrinking in the last several weeks. The number of deaths per day has also been showing a decline in the last several days.

Two men held for murdering youth in Delhi

New Delhi: Two men were arrested on Friday for allegedly murdering a youth over arguments in an e-rickshaw in the Mohan Garden area of Delhi, the police said. The police reached the spot after receiving a call at Rannahola police station regarding the murder.

Speaking to ANI, the police said, "We found a youth lying on the ground in blood after reaching the spot. The injured was immediately admitted to Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital and was declared dead upon arrival." "We have also met an eyewitness of the murder, Gopal, who works as a watchman at Jayswal Vatika, Uttam Nagar," the police added.

The police have also seized the knife used in the murder. According to the police, one of the eyewitnesses Gopal who works as a watchman at Jayswal Vatika, Uttam Nagar.

The eyewitness said that he was standing at Gandhi Chowk after taking a meal and saw that a boy with golden colour hair was beating another boy. In the meantime, his companion standing there took a knife and hit him several times. When the injured fell down,

The assailants tried to escape from the spot. However, after the successful attempt of catching the boys, the eyewitness managed to catch one assailant, police informed. During the investigation process, the police managed to nab the other accused also with the help of CCTV footage of nearby areas.

The assailants — Lav Kumar and Krishan Kumar — confessed their crime and identities when police interrogated them. They said that the victim was continuously interrupting them by using unparliamentary language and making loud noises, according to the police. An FIR was filed against both the accused under 302/34 sections of the Indian Penal Code, Delhi police said.

26-year-old held by stranger over petty issue

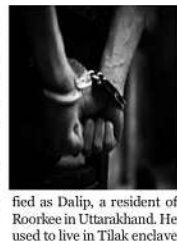
New Delhi: A 26-year-old man was allegedly stabbed to death by two persons after he asked them to not make loud noises while they were travelling in an e-rickshaw, police said on Saturday.

The accused, identified as Lav Kumar (21), a resident of Mohan Garden, Sainik Enclave, and Deepak (23), a resident of Faridkot in Punjab, have been arrested.

On Friday, a PCR call was received at Rannahola police station around 11.30 pm regarding murder at main Gandhi Chowk, Mohan Garden, police said.

Thereafter, police reached the spot and found a man lying on the ground in a pool of blood. The injured was immediately shifted to the DDU hospital where he was declared dead, a senior police officer said.

The deceased was identified



as Dalip, a resident of Roorkee in Uttarakhand. He used to live in Tilak enclave Part 1, Mohan Garden, Uttam Nagar with his maternal aunt and worked as salesman in a mall in Dwarka, police said.

Dalip received three stab injuries on chest, waist and thigh, they said.

Gopal, a watchman at Jayswal Vatika, Uttam Nagar, is an eyewitness in the case. Around 11 pm, he was standing at Gandhi Chowk and saw that one person with golden hair was beating

the victim, Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Parvinder Singh said.

Meanwhile, the other person standing there took a knife and stabbed him a few times. When the injured fell down, the assailants tried to escape, however, Gopal tried to stop them and managed to catch hold of one of the accused near the spot, the DCP said.

A case was registered under Sections 302 (Murder) and 34 (Common Intention) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) at Rannahola police station, they said.

The accused, Lav Kumar, told police that he and his friend Deepak were coming back to Mohan Garden from a birthday party in Dwarka, Singh said.

They boarded an e-rickshaw in which another person was also sitting who was regularly interrupting them

not to make loud noises and using foul language, police said.

An argument broke out when all of them got down at Gandhi Chowk and the accused stabbed the victim.

When the accused realised that Dalip has fallen down, they tried to run away, but one of them was caught near the spot, police said.

During investigation, the CCTV footage of the nearby areas were checked and co-accused Deepak was also nabbed.

The knife used in the crime has been recovered, they said.

Deepak and Kumar used to work at a cloth shop around two years ago. Deepak went back to his home last year and returned Delhi this week to look for a job.

Kumar works as a salesman in a private firm, police added.

Two held for duping of 10 lakh on pretext of providing fake loans

New Delhi: Delhi Police on Saturday arrested two people for allegedly duping over 50 people of Rs 10 lakh on the pretext of providing fake loans under the 'Pradhan Mantri Mudra Loan Yojana' from their office located in Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh. Inter-State Cell found out that the accused Inderjeet Pandey (27) and Amit Kumar (23) were running their racket from an office at Vasundhara Ghaziabad through a fake website that is <http://mudrafinance.in> to cheat innocent people, said Delhi Police.

Delhi Police laid a trap and arrested Inderjeet and Amit from their office at Vasundhara and recovered incriminating material that includes seven mobile phones that were used in calling and messaging the customers, one laptop, two pen drives containing the data of the cheated customers, forged loan approval letters, affidavits, four registers containing date wise calling details with the loan seekers, bank passbooks, debit card of Punjab National Bank that was being used for receiving the amount by cheating the customers. During the interrogation, the police found that Inderjeet, a resident of Vasundhara Ghaziabad started working at a call centre situ-

ated at Laxmi Nagar in 2014 while Amit, a resident of Mandoli, Delhi, and a college dropout also joined the same call centre in 2016.

Both of them decided to open their own business and in January 2021, started their racket to cheat people for money on the pretext of providing a loan in the name of 'Pradhan Mantri Mudra Loan Yojana', according to the police. In order to execute their plan, Amit and Inderjeet took a rented office in Ghaziabad. Inderjeet got his website <http://mudrafinance.in> prepared and attached a pop-up link and mobile number to the website, stated the police.

"Whenever any loan seeker visited his website, the pop-up link appeared automatically. To proceed further, the loan seeker had to fill up his details i.e. name, the amount required, mobile number, and e-mail ID. Through this process, Inderjeet accessed the details of loan seekers and started contacting him. He targeted loan seekers from Eastern Region and South Region more as he thought that due to physical distance no one would come after him with a complaint," the police said. As per the police, Inderjeet arranged a fake approval letter of 'Pradhan Mantri Mudra Loan Yojana to lure his victims.

Mindfulness has become a turning point in lives of students studying in Delhi Schools: Sisodia

New Delhi: The Delhi Government takes pride in saying that the Happiness Curriculum has turned out to be a huge success for Delhi.

Because of mindfulness, children are able to concentrate better in their studies. Mindfulness has come as a turning point in the lives of students studying in Delhi schools. Mindfulness has relieved children from stress and increased their focus in studies."

The Deputy Chief Minister

stated, "Mindfulness is a gift given by India to the world in the field of Emotional Science. India has given its thousands of years old tradition of meditation to the world, but with time it has forgotten its value.

The actual goal of mindfulness is to focus on your life but mindfulness now has become limited to just 15 minutes of meditation. People have learned to meditate very well but have not learned how to focus on their life. If we practise mindfulness by understanding its true meaning and start paying attention in our life too, then we can never do anything wrong."

Sisodia said, "We need to make mindfulness a mass movement. Every Indian needs to live life with mindfulness. In order to practise mindfulness in children from a young age, Delhi Government has started the Happiness Curriculum from the very beginning of the school, so that children start their day with 5-10 minutes of mindfulness daily and make mindfulness an integral part of their life."

Sisodia shared that mindfulness has also brought self-confidence in children, especially during COVID, when the entire world was living in an atmosphere of tension and fear.
