YEIDA to launch residential plot scheme soon

The Yamuna Expressway Industrial Development Authority (YEIDA) is soon going to launch a residential plot scheme.

The aforesaid plot scheme, which had been entangled between the Uttar Pradesh Real Estate Regulatory Authority and the Yamuna Authority for nearly three months, has finally been resolved. The YEIDA has accepted RERA's conditions regarding the plot scheme.

Following RERA registration, the plot scheme is expected to launch this month. The Yamuna Authority applied to RERA for registration of a plan for 973 residential plots in the new year. However, due to objections, the plan was stuck between RERA and the YEIDA for three months.

Yamuna Authority CEO Shaileendra Bhatia stated that all the RERA objections have been resolved. The registration process for the plot scheme would be completed soon and the scheme would be launched after that.

Under the scheme, the YEIDA is launching the plot scheme in sector 15C for the first time. Plots will also be allotted in sectors 18 and 24A. The scheme will include a total of 755 plots in the general category. The plot sizes range from 162 square meters to 990 square meters. The largest number of plots, 481, are in the 200 square meter category, and 476 are in the 162 square meter category.

Under YEIDA's terms, ten percent of the plot's value must be deposited as a registration fee at the time of application. Upon allotment, the remaining 90 percent of the total cost must be paid within 60 days. Implementation of the Agreement to Lease rule will increase the burden of stamp duty on allottees, along with the lump sum payment.

UPSRTC to run 100 buses in Noida

The Uttar Pradesh State Road Transport Corporation (UPSRTC) will run 100 buses to improve public transport service in Noida.

Noida Authority CEO Krishna Karunesh stated that a special purpose vehicle (SPV) would be formed for this purpose. This company will coordinate routes with the authority. Until these buses arrive, 50 buses will operate as standby, which will be removed later. These buses will be for promoting public transport.

He said that around 20 buses each would be run on two to three main routes. These include Noida to Greater Noida via Expressway, Noida to Greater Noida West and Greater Noida and the third one is from Noida to Jewar International Airport.

A GM level officer in Noida will be included in the SPV. The routes will be decided only after a meeting with the authority. Bus stands will also be built accordingly. These UPSRTC buses will also have their own drivers and conductors. The authority will provide coordination and logistics for parking the buses.

These buses will benefit approximately five lakh people. The metro and RRTS will take some time to arrive, so these buses will be crucial for public transportation. In Noida, people commute by tempo and e-rickshaw, in addition to the metro.

Help accident victims, get ₹25,000; CM Gupta rollout Centre's 'Rah-Veer' Scheme in Delhi

Assistance to the Seriously Injured Within the Golden Hour; Legal Protection to Encourage Citizens: CM Rekha Gupta

In order to provide a reward amount of ₹25,000 to citizens helping seriously injured victims of road accidents in Delhi, Chief Minister Rekha Gupta on Monday officially rolled out the implementation of the Central Government's 'Rah-Veer' scheme in Delhi.

The Delhi government will also give a certificate of appreciation to smart citizens for helping the injured. She announced.

The scheme aims to encourage people to provide assistance without fear of legal issues, emphasising the need for prompt medical attention within the 'golden hour' to save lives.

Chief Minister Rekha Gupta highlighted that this initiative aims to reduce road accident fatalities by motivating more citizens to help injured individuals.



She pointed out that many people are hesitant to assist due to concerns about legal complications or police involvement. The scheme seeks to eliminate these fears and inspire timely action, especially in a busy city like Delhi where quick medical response can be critical.

The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) has provided guidelines for the effective implementation of the scheme, which aligns with Good Samaritan Rules that offer legal protection to those who aid seriously injured persons.

This financial reward is designed to promote public participation in helping accident victims and fostering a compassionate society.

Individuals who assist seriously injured victims and ensure their transport to medical facilities within the golden hour will be eligible

for the ₹25,000 reward. If someone saves multiple victims in one accident, they will still receive a maximum of ₹25,000. Additionally, ten exceptional helpers, known as Rah-Veers, will be chosen each year to receive a special national award of ₹1 lakh each, along with a certificate of appreciation.

To oversee the program's implementation, a District Level Evaluation Committee will be formed, including various officials such as the District Magistrate and police officers. The reward funds will be transferred directly to beneficiaries' bank accounts through a digital process, ensuring transparency and efficiency.

The Chief Minister expressed her belief that this initiative will cultivate a culture of timely assistance in emergencies, addressing barriers that discourage citizens from helping due to legal fears.

The 'Rah-Veer' scheme represents more than just monetary incentives; it aims to enhance humanitarian values and improve road safety in Delhi. If executed with integrity and seriousness, it has the potential to prevent many tragedies and alleviate family grief related to road accidents.

30 lost Phones back in safe hands as Lajpat Nagar Police act swiftly

As part of the 79th Delhi Police Week celebrations, the South-East District of Delhi Police marked the occasion with a people-centric initiative, recovering and returning 30 lost and stolen mobile phones to their rightful owners in Lajpat Nagar.

The recovery drive was carried out by the team of Lajpat Nagar Police Station under the leadership of SHO Nishan Kumar Sharma and the guidance of DCP Hemant Tiwari. Acting on complaints of missing and stolen mobile phones, the police launched a focused operation combining technical surveillance, CCTV footage analysis and sustained fieldwork.

Officials tracked several devices across multiple locations, including areas outside the district. Persistent

follow-up and technical analysis eventually led the team to the accused and enabled the recovery of the phones. After verifying ownership and completing the necessary legal formalities, SHO Nishan Kumar Sharma personally handed over the devices to their owners.

For many recipients, the return of their phones meant more than just recovering a gadget. Several citizens said their devices contained important documents, photographs and crucial personal data, all of which were restored safely.

They expressed appreciation for the prompt response and efforts of the police team.

DCP Hemant Tiwari said that Delhi Police Week is not merely ceremonial but an opportunity to strengthen public trust through meaningful action.

Delhi plans auto appeal system for time bound services

Delhi's Health and IT Minister Pankaj Kumar Singh on Monday reviewed the proposed introduction of a system driven Auto Appeal Mechanism under the Delhi Right to Service Act, aimed at ensuring citizens receive government services within fixed timelines without having to pursue appeals on their own.

Chairing a high level meeting, Dr Singh examined ways to strengthen the existing framework of the Act, under which 537 services are currently monitored through the e-SLA portal. At present, while service timelines are defined, applicants themselves must file an appeal if there is a delay in delivery.

Officials discussed a proposal to make the appeal process automatic. Under the new mechanism, if a department fails to deliver a service within the stipulated time, the system would automatically trigger an appeal without requiring any action from the applicant. The model would also incorporate a structured escalation process to senior and provide real time tracking through digital dashboards to enhance oversight and



transparency.

The meeting also reviewed the functioning of the Haryana Right to Service Act, particularly its Auto Appeal System that includes automatic escalation and penalties. The Haryana model is being considered as a reference point for strengthening Delhi's framework.

Dr Singh directed officials to conduct a detailed study of best practices adopted in other states and develop a robust structure suited to Delhi's administrative needs. Discussions were also held on possible amendments to the Act and the technical upgrades required to integrate the upgraded mechanism seamlessly across departments through the e-

SLA portal. An implementation timeline of around six months was discussed, subject to necessary approvals.

"Our priority is to ensure that citizens receive time bound services without having to pursue appeals themselves. A system driven Auto Appeal Mechanism will make accountability automatic and transparent," Dr Singh said.

The Delhi government maintains that the proposed reform is part of its broader push to strengthen transparency, improve efficiency and build a governance system where delays are addressed proactively by the administration rather than leaving citizens to chase their entitlements.

Shahdara Police unveil 'DP-Drishti' to track criminals in real time

In a major technological push to strengthen law and order, Delhi Police has launched a high-tech mobile surveillance vehicle equipped with a Face Recognition System (FRS) in Shahdara district. The vehicle, named 'DP-Drishti' (Delhi Police - Dynamic Real-Time Identification and Surveillance for Human Tracking Initiative), was introduced in the busy Gandhi Nagar market area.

The launch took place in the presence of Shahdara Deputy Commissioner of Police Prashant Gautam, ACP Mohinder Singh and Gandhi Nagar SHO Rajkumar. Officials said the initiative marks a significant step toward modernising policing in densely populated commercial zones.

The DP-Drishti vehicle is fitted with advanced CCTV cameras integrated with facial recognition technology. As it moves through crowded markets and public spaces, the system scans faces and matches them against the police database of listed offenders. If a suspect or previously registered



criminal is detected, the team inside the vehicle receives an immediate alert, enabling swift preventive or corrective action.

According to police officials, the mobile unit will primarily operate in high-footfall areas such as Gandhi Nagar, Krishna Nagar, Shahdara and Mandoli Road. The system is capable of identifying multiple individuals within large gatherings and can capture and store high-quality images within milliseconds for secure legal documentation.

DCP Prashant Gautam said the deployment of DP-Drishti will make it increasingly difficult for criminals to conceal themselves in public spaces. He added that if any notorious offender enters a

market or crowded locality, the team will receive real-time information and act promptly.

The project was successfully rolled out by the technical team of Shahdara district. ASI Deepak Kumar, Head Constable Gagan Deep, Head Constable Jitender and Head Constable Abhay played a key role in deploying and operationalising the system.

With features such as real-time facial recognition and matching, mobile deployment capability, dynamic human tracking and automated image capture for legal records, the initiative aims to create what police officials describe as a "zero blind spot" environment in commercial hubs.

Shahdara sees faster development as Delhi Govt marks one year

As the Delhi government completed one year in office, Shahdara MLA Sanjay Goyal on Monday presented a detailed account of development works undertaken in the constituency, stating that the pace of progress has significantly accelerated over the past year.

Addressing a press conference, the MLA said that focused efforts have been made to resolve long-pending public issues while pushing forward infrastructure and civic improvement projects. He highlighted measures taken to curb drug abuse in the area, noting that special drives were carried out in coordination with the police and local administration. These campaigns, he said, have shown encouraging results. To address the recurring problem of waterlogging, particularly during the monsoon season, permanent pumps have been installed under flyovers across the constituency. The move has provided much-needed relief to residents who previously faced severe inconvenience during heavy rains.

Goyal also pointed to improvements in public spaces, stating that several parks which were earlier in poor condition have now been cleaned and brought under regular maintenance. Continuous cleanliness and upkeep drives have helped improve the local environment and enhance community spaces. On encroachment, the MLA reiterated that footpaths and said action has been taken against illegal roadside vendors occupying public walkways. The initiative aims to ensure smoother and safer movement for residents. To ease traffic congestion, certain U-turns and road cuts that frequently caused bottlenecks are being done as part of a broader traffic management plan. Goyal expressed confidence that these steps will lead to better traffic flow in Shahdara. District in-charge Dr. Anil Gupta, District President Deepak Gaba, Assembly Mandal Presidents Vikas Sharma, Lakhan Gautam and Sanjeev Madan, along with district office bearers Lalit and Vishal and Media In-charge Vivek Pathania, were present at the press conference.
