

Noida Authority clears Rs 40 crore land of encroachment

Noida: The Noida Authority has removed illegal encroachment and demolished unauthorised construction from around 4,200 square metres of land in Sector 77 here, officials said.

The action was carried out by the Work Circle 6 team on land bearing Kharsa No. 18 in village Sorakha, following directions of the Noida Authority Chief Executive Officer.

The land, valued at around Rs 40 crore, had been earmarked for development of a Master Green area. According to the authority, encroachers had illegally occupied the plot and carried out construction on it.

The authority said the encroacher had approached the court through petition No. 758/2025 and sought relief against the action being taken by the Noida Authority in connection with construction and development works at the site.

## CM Yogi pitches UP as global textile hub, seeks value-chain expansion

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Tuesday pitched the state as a potential global textile hub and said the government was working to develop the entire value chain from fibre and yarn to garments and brands for the international market. Inaugurating the two-day UP Textiles Conclave-2026 here, Adityanath said the state has heritages, skills, human resources, industry, entrepreneurship and a large domestic market that can help it emerge as a major global textile centre.

"Uttar Pradesh means UP, that is, 'Ultimate Potential', he said, adding that the state's objective was to develop the complete textile value chain, from fibre to yarn, yarn to fabric, fabric to garment and garment to brand.

During the event, the chief minister launched the UP Tek Mitra Portal and the Hachikargha Banahar Samridhi Yojana. Memoranda of understanding were signed for proposed investments worth Rs 5,496 crore in the textile sector, while Letters of Comfort

worth Rs 163 crore and subsidies totalling Rs 60 crore were distributed. The chief minister said Uttar Pradesh's textile heritage dates back thousands of years and cited Varanasi silk, Bhadohi carpets, Lucknow chikankari, Bareilly zari, Kanpur's textile ecosystem and the potential for technical textiles in Meerut as examples of the state's capabilities.

The state has around two lakh handloom and more than five lakh powerloom weavers, he said, adding that the textile sector is the largest em-

ployment-generating industry after agriculture.

Adityanath said Uttar Pradesh ranks third in the country in fabric manufacturing and accounts for around 13-14 per cent of total fabric production.

Exports of textiles, garments and handicrafts from the state have increased by around 55 per cent over the past six years, making Uttar Pradesh the fourth-largest exporting state in the sector, he said.

Gautam Buddha Nagar recorded exports of more than Rs 21,000 crore in 2025-26 and

has emerged as the country's second-largest exporting district, he added.

Referring to the Centre's target of building a USD 350 billion textile and apparel economy and achieving USD 100 billion in exports by 2030, Adityanath said Uttar Pradesh would make a significant contribution towards the national goal.

He said products from more than 35 districts had received a new identity through the One District-One Product initiative, while 17 textile products from the state

had received Geographical Indication tags.

The chief minister also highlighted the participation of women through self-help groups and said the state's young workforce could play an important role in taking the textile industry to new heights.

Adityanath also attached previous governments over the law-and-order situation in the state, claiming that crime, extortion and disturbances had discouraged investment and industrial development before 2017.

He said the state had since undergone a major transformation, with improved law and order and investor-friendly policies creating a more conducive environment for industries.

## Noida police bust mobile snatching gang, three held

Noida: Police have busted a gang allegedly involved in motorcycle theft and mobile phone snatching in Delhi-NCR and arrested three people, recovering 14 stolen and snatched mobile phones and two stolen motorcycles, officials said on Tuesday.

The accused, identified as Ashu Kumar, 20, Mannu Kumar, 19, and Naved Khan, 32, were arrested by Sector 20 police from the service road in Sector 28 on the basis of local intelligence and electronic surveillance, police said.

The police recovered



14 mobile phones allegedly linked to theft and snatching incidents, two stolen motorcycles, Rs 5,000 in cash, a tool used to break motorcycle locks and two illegal knives from their possession.

During interrogation, the accused allegedly told police that Ashu and Mannu used stolen motorcycles to target pedestrians and snatch their mobile phones in different parts of Delhi-NCR.

The snatched phones were subsequently handed over to Naved, who runs a mobile phone repair shop, police said.

Mannu works as a motorcycle mechanic, while Naved allegedly sold the stolen phones and their parts through his repair shop. The money earned from the illegal activities was subsequently divided among the three, according to police.

Police said several cases related to theft, snatching, cheating and other serious offences have been registered against the accused at various police stations in Noida, Delhi and Bulandshahr.

## Badalpur police bust interstate vehicle theft gang, recover 14 two-wheelers

Greater Noida: Badalpur police have busted an interstate gang involved in stealing two-wheelers and arrested two alleged members, recovering 13 motorcycles, a scooter and two illegal knives from their possession and on their disclosure, officials said on Tuesday.

The action was carried out on September 8 on the basis of manual intelligence and confidential information, police said.

The arrested accused have been identified as Saif Ali, 28, a resident



of Pawal under Jarcho police station, and Shadab, 27, a resident of Chand Mohalla in Dadri.

During interrogation, police found that Saif Ali worked as a mechan-

According to police, after stealing the vehicles, the accused hid them in deserted vacant plots and later sold them to passers-by at cheap prices. The proceeds were divided between the two and allegedly used for personal expenses and leisure.

Police said cases related to vehicle theft and other offences have been registered against the accused at Badalpur, Dadri and Shalimar Garden police stations in Ghaziabad, besides Fatehpur Jiri in New Delhi.
